FCC Jurisdiction and Regulatory Obligations

 Universal Service Requirements Register with the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) to obtain a Filer ID. Annually file a FCC 499-A Form for revenue reporting. Ensure timely monthly payments to USAC for the Universal Service Fund (USF) and other federal fees. 	Comprehensive Regulatory Compliance Adhere to CALEA (Communications Assistance for Law Enforcement Act) regulations. Comply with CPNI (Customer Proprietary Network Information) regulations. Abide by CVAA (Twenty-First Century Communications and Video
TRACED Act & TCPA Compliance Work with the National Exchange Carrier Association (NECA) to get an Operating Company Number (OCN). Register in the Robocall Mitigation	Accessibility Act) regulations. Ensure mandatory 911 and emergency service provisions (Kari's Law, RAY BAUM'S Act, and Alyssa's Law). Report network outages promptly using the FCC's Network Outage Reporting System. Submit Form 477 reporting (Local Telephone Competition and Broadband Reporting).
Database. File Robocall Mitigation Plans (RMPs) with the FCC demonstrating effective policies and procedures to prevent illegal and harmful robocall traffic. Work with iConnectiv to secure a Service Provider Code token. This token represents your validated credentials as a service provider. Work with an approved Certificate Authority (CA), to get a digital certificate based on your token. This certificate is used to sign/attest calls	State and Local Obligations Register and pay taxes and fees directly to various state and local governments.
